





How the Update was Prepared


- Comparisons to similar systems

- Change to hourly rental rate for greater fairness and to allow more reservations

- Projected revenue increase of \$262
 - □ From \$2,525 to \$2,787



- Fewer categories
- Both sides of Rotary Pavilion for smaller groups





Athletic Field Fees

- Memorial Field
 - Projected revenue increase of \$2,821
 - From \$23,990 to \$26,811
- □ HJ Carroll Park
 - Projected revenue increase of \$625
 - From \$5,225 to \$5,850



Campground Fees

- Oak Bay and Quilcene
- Projected revenue increase of \$3,918
 - □ From \$20,616 to \$24,534
- Additional vehicle fee of \$10
- New special bicycle rate

- Increases each year to increase cost recovery rate
 - Average increase in 2014

- \$60

- Reg. form asks for \$5 donation for scholarship
- \$5 discount for brother or sisters in league

- □ Fall Soccer: \$11,080
- □ Kinder Sports: \$660
- □ Spring Soccer: \$9,000
- □ Pre-K Enrichment: \$770
- Sports Camps: \$3,000
- Open Gyms: \$1,000
- □ Total: \$25,510

Rules Regarding Payment and Refunds

- Payment at-time-of reservation or registration required now included in ordinance (deposits)
- Refund policy, now included in ordinance
- One year in advance maximum limit for reservations – new rule
