

Welcome to our Jefferson County Campgrounds

General info

Choose an empty campsite and pay immediately.

Make sure your site looks occupied if you leave for the day in your vehicle.

Site sizes vary. All vehicles and gear must fit properly into your site. Never block roads or intrude on neighboring sites.

All campgrounds have a 10-night stay limit. 3 nights out resets the limit. You may stay at another Jefferson County campground for your 3 nights out.

All campgrounds are first come, first served.

Assistance

Payment

Pay at entrance kiosk. Please pay for your entire stay at once.

- 1. Fill out one payment envelope for each site you'll use.
- 2. Seal payment in the envelope and detach the top.
- 3. Drop payment in the metal tube.
- 4. Clip the envelope top to your campsite post. This is your permit.

Holding sites

You may hold up to 3 adjacent sites for up to 24 hours before your stay. To do this you must:

- 1. Choose empty sites, pay in advance and post permits at each site.
- 2. Occupy each site by doing one of the following:
 - a. Pitching a tent.
 - b. Leaving a vehicle.
 - c. Setting up 3 chairs, a cooler, and a tablecloth.

After your 24-hour hold, you must be on-site at least 8 hours per 24-hour period.

Parking

Your campsite fee covers parking for 2 vehicles. You may have 1 extra vehicle for \$10 extra. A vehicle is defined as a car, truck, motorcycle, RV, or trailer. Only one camper unit per site.

Visitors may join you from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. They must use day-use parking.

Checking out

Check out time is 3 p.m. sharp on the last day paid. Please remove your permit from the post when you leave the site.

Fire safety

Fires are allowed only in designated fire rings. Never leave a campfire unattended. Douse all fires. Check countyrec.com for burn ban status.

Dispose of cigarette butts in the provided trash bins or pack them out with your garbage. Never flick a cigarette into the bushes.

Fireworks are prohibited in all Jefferson County Parks.

Laws and ordinances

Dogs must be leashed at all times.

Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. No generators or loud voices during quiet hours.

No amplified music at any time.

Washington state law prohibits public use of alcohol and cannabis.
